Bird Droppings

As I look out my window, the trees bow down as a gust of wind passes by. Welcome to California. Autumn 2019.

Normally, I write about ship-related memories, stories about Navy days, or saluting guys who were so much a part of SBR history. Today I'd like to depart from that and tell you what it's like out here on the left coast.

Heavy, gusty winds that approach 80 mph are combining with tinder-dry fields of grass to make it easy for fires to get started and to wipe out thousands of acres of California land. Combine that with the problems that our local electric company – PG&E is having with faulty equipment, power lines that snap and ignite brush fires, and a normal season of no rain until November. Last year we lost the entire town of Paradise, the previous year Santa Rosa was the victim of the worst fire in California history. In all, 85 people died in the Paradise fire. They are just now getting back into rebuilt homes in Santa Rosa.

Last night my son called from Santa Rosa, asking if they could come over to Sacramento in case of evacuation orders. They weren't in any immediate danger, but had taken the precaution of packaging up all their important papers in case they had to evacuate immediately. They would rather stay home as the highways were a mess, and with electricity turned off, traffic lights were not working, no TV, and you sit around in candlelight for a few days. Schools are closed because so many people have had to evacuate, and businesses are closed because of the lack of electricity. And of course there's the loss of income all the way around. It's not a good situation.

I know that the rest of the country has it's problems too, with hurricanes, tornadoes, heavy snowfalls, flooding, and the list goes on. But can you imagine what it would be like to have to evacuate your home and not know if it (or even your whole neighborhood) would still be there when you came back.

Where's all this going? Well, there's not anything you can do about it except grouse over past mismanagement of our power grid, the ineptitude of people responsible for management of public lands, and the acceptance of the vagaries of Mother Nature herself.

And now that I've gotten all that off my chest, I'd like to congratulate all of those who had a hand in making the recent reunion such a success. They did a bang-up job.

And it seems the announcements of members passing away seems to be getting ever more frequent. The latest note I got was about John Durant. I remember John's auction contributions at previous reunions, and how they just stood out as really special and well done. John was a personality larger than life, and his presence at future reunions will be sorely missed. This should also serve as a reminder to get in touch with some of your old shipmates, whom you haven't seen in years, even though you may find it difficult to get to any of the reunions. Our Association officers maintain a list of active shipmates, so if you want to find out about or get in touch with a long lost buddy, they may be able to help. Kevin McKeown keeps a list for dues purposes, Jim Norton has a list of Scuttlebutt recipients.

With that I guess it's time to think back on Christmases you spent in the Navy, and especially on board the SBR. Of the Christmas tree on the mess deck, of the snowfall in Boston, patrolling eastern harbors on Christmas eve, of getting to some kind of church service, of both the loneliness and the camaraderie you may have experienced. I especially remember the special Christmas menu that the mess cooks would prepare – from the nuts to the cigarettes, and everything in between. It was a special time. It was a special place, and we were part of it.

May your holidays be filled with good friends, good times, good memories, and the love of not only the season but always.
